Why we don't use words like Pride or rainbow which some people think are over commercialized and or cheesy. They're probably licensed. You probably can't have a pride March without getting some sort of approval from World Pride and obviously Sydney Mardi Gras. If this was to happen in New South Wales anywhere, particularly Sydney Metro they'd say that you can't use the words. Mardi, Gras. So I'll call it the quiz first March, and there has to be a strict value, set down. Now, I noticed on Mardi Gras.

Entrenched is the question and I think there has to be a fair argument that that it is and the situation.
