Last few months where else not too many other places apart from 3. CR you'd hear about tilde the trans and gender diverse Film Festival. We had the fabulous robe right talking their passion for films, which I think is just enormous and these are the sort of things that are just not likely to get discussion on Commercial media and are not likely to get a lot of discussion in a lot of other media anywhere else.

So really really important that we give voice is like can the fabulous tool the film festival. I've always so you can go see them radio end audio together. That's what we do on 3 CR but there's one thing that I found in my message slot this morning, and I'm going to explain something

which shows how 3 CR works together. Why didn't call it a pigeon hole because pigeon hole has a very animal cruelty thing, which if you're and please support freedom of species for there.

Radio show on a clock and I didn't know that so let's call the message slots, but I had a beautiful message that came in on the 3 CR text line last week when I talked about looking after our elders and seniors and this is the sort of debate the 3 CR at the Grassroots can start. This is just gone right to the heart of 3 CR unintentionally and right I have to say to my heart quote as a younger trans woman born in 1995 have been in Social spending.

Spaces with a variety of Ages in our community some of my younger peers are often ignoring all the members of our community or showing little patience and understanding social spaces seemed Geared for us younglings and it frustrates me when my peers are inclusive of Elders in those spaces. We need to have these conversations with each other and Bridge generational divide so we can become a stronger community.

Sometimes an older person may use language in a way that is a bit uncomfortable for us younger quiz. I find that a respectful conversation between both parties to understand each other's use of language and we form a stronger Bond and understanding of each other Amy Amy absolutely brilliant. And this is why you know, I try to get these conversations going on out of the pan. It's really really important we have them and now we've started it and I think this is a conversation we need to have

Ooh have you know there's two parts to this one. These are the sort of conversations that can happen on unfettered community radio. When you have Community radio that gives that voice that we need and isn't constrained by any commercial or other constraints constraining constraints. That's a really important thing as to the conversation itself. Yeah, look there does seem to be somewhat of a generation gap.

On a few fronts, I mean at times I found that perhaps younger quiz weren't aware that we had no anti-discrimination protections in Victoria until 2000 and perhaps younger cui's don't understand you could have been fired for your job for being gay bi trans lesbian anything under the Igbtiq i+ umbrella just because you were and we didn't have Federal Protection until 2013. It hasn't always been there. So that's one thing where people don't understand and there was unfortunately,

But as it is to talk about a lot of outright intense hate of people and a lot more violence one bit of violence. Of course is one too many one bit of queer phobic violence or any Prejudice violence is one bit too many and these are conversations. We need to have their difficult. It's not a nice topic if that topic is upsetting to you. Please call Q Life which includes switchboard in Victoria and Tasmania 1-800 1845 27

But we need it and the other one on language. I mean, this is a big one in those terms fade in our community and let's call an obvious one here transsexual. Now, you can't say to people you can't use it if that term is someone particularly for someone in the middle or senior cohort is all they had can't tell him to not use it that's their term. And yes, it's a very medicalized term but that's all people had and it's what they Clank clung to.

Claimed to in those times so you can't tell people to stop using it. Everyone's individual term is their own it's just not an umbrella term and probably can't be and that's fair and that's reasonable enough. So this is I really appreciate this note. In fact, I'm going to say this. I'm you I will be framing this above my desk at home. This is just made my day but these are the

conversations that we have on 3 CR at the Grassroots about a whole heap of the issues Queer on out of the pan and other

Unfortunately as passed away in the last week or so Lynn Conway has according to this report in the morning hyphen times.com Lynn who was 86 at the time of passing and Lynn story is really really important and things that we sometimes forget. She her death was announced by the University of Michigan and she was on the engineering faculty.

Guilty there until 1998 and she focused on the next Innovation and she's credited with developing a simpler method for Designing microchips in the 70s and other things and she had two degrees from Columbia University. She joined IBM in 1964 after graduating with two degrees as opposed to a musical group that was three degrees and where else you're going to hear bad puns like that, but still

Donate 94 1983 double seven and but seriously in 1968 IBM fired her after she disclosed she was undergoing a gender transition and although the happy ending on that note is you got an apology in 2020 and was awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award and you know the story though in the middle is that Lynn will say in her turn.

Completed her gender affirmation to use today's language completed surgery and then had to start again elsewhere getting work as a data entry clerk, which is obviously a sad waste of skill, but obviously moved up pretty quickly and the story was in 1997. I remember this book again. It was just time of my own beginning my own Journeys in everything really and a reporter looking at the 30th anniversary of the work at IBM after they declared

Pacified paperwork got this call from someone called Lynn Conway. And this reporter could tell Lynn Conway new everything, you know, just it was that inside information. It wasn't just parroting tracks or anything. But the reporter said well, hang on. There's no lint Conway named in any where any of the paperwork how come you know so much about this or words to that effect. And that's where Linda's closed. She was trained. She had to use a term which I know some people don't like if we're talking terms. We don't like but sometimes it is a term that gets used and is

Needed and is necessary for some people she'd been in stealth and I think that these sorts of stories are very very important and it's where Community radio like out of the pan likes 3 CR comes in and you hear them. And so I think we need to honor sort of her her work. It's great to see that IBM recognized her once that's in said quote. She broke down barriers for the trans community and pushed the limits of Technology.

Through Levitt revolutionary workers still impacting Our Lives to this day said nickel Lamar low IBM's Chief priests or Human Resources officer 2014 video on YouTube Conway reflected on her transition saying there's hardly any knowledge in our society even about the existence of transgender identities in the 1960s. I think that's what a lot of that is really hit now because parents who have children are discovering if they let their person blossom into who they need to be. They just often see remarkable flourishing hehe.

So yeah, absolutely, right she'd worked at Xerox the National Science Foundation the defense Advanced research projects agency and on many honorary degrees. So these are sort of Stories We need to tell and Community radio can do it and I did have the pleasure on and on another Community radio station of interviewing Lynn many years ago lovely lovely person rest in peace Lynn and it's these sorts of stories that need to get told but you will only hear them. The on shows like out of the pan on 3 CR so, please support our radiothon 94 1983 double seven. So yes part of trans history enzyme obviously little sad. She was sort of someone who I think at a time when there wasn't enough visibility of trans role models and God knows I have enough trouble turning my laptop on but she just said here's someone who that says trans people can be anyone you could be a computer scientist you could be

Whoever you could be, you know, I don't know actor who ever else you could just be a trans person and be yourself and I think she gave a great deal of visibility to our communities.
