Opened up today appropriately with Midnight Oil from the Earth and Sun and Moon album In the Valley because in Moonee Valley we have someone running for council and someone who's organized a great fundraiser to assist them. It is my pleasure to welcome to the 3 CR Studios Jody Kinnersly and Ellen Chan. Welcome. Hi Sally. Hey Jody good to have you with us. And if it's okay to ask can I check in with which pronouns you use event she/her pronouns and Ellen? Can I check in with you - sheet, they she vote. So we've got a diversity of people in the studio, which is always good because we love diversity Jody. I'll start with you. What why on Earth would someone stops aside to run for politics at any level seriously, what mode of what motivated you to do? Such a such a thing. Well, you know, I just want to make the world a better place sounds fair, but I really, you know, I'm running for local government in particular because I do have this sense that like I can make my own patch of the world better. I'm really worried about, you know, climate change and the housing crisis and yeah genocide in

Stein and

You know, I can sit sit at home worrying about those things so I can do what I can to try and look around at my neighbors and represent them and their Progressive values that I share in local government fair enough. That's that's a good enough answer to summarize it and Ellen.

Give us the overview. How do you fit into this situation? Because we're here to talk about an event called quiz to the front celebrating queer community and Artistry and moonee Valley. How do you fit in?

Through it all. So I am also a resident in me many Bali and so just doing a bit of work here to support Jody a local candidate. And so we thought would have this awesome quiz to the front event and you know in many Valley we do have a very diverse, you know, Igbtqia+ Community, but we don't really feel like at the moment. There aren't really kind of these events to you know,

To connect and with the LGBT community so we thought we just put it on a big. Yeah queer old party that always sounds like a good thing. Can we have enough queer parties? And of course, that's an unanswerable question, which is really really good. And now I'll continue with your own. You know, what's it who Who's involved in the in the queer put in the crew party?

From the will say Artistry front Okay. So we've got two really exciting drag queens. Yeah, Tilly Capulet and Melissa intent who will be obviously showcasing some of their drag performances are really excited to have them in terms of yeah other musicians, we've got Jackie who is a Chinese Cambodian queer artist actually bumped into him randomly on the street.

He was busking on swanston Street the other day and I was like that was the first time I actually met him properly in person. Uh, so that's a bit. There was a bit cute. Also, we've got Max or rora who is an intersect non-binary musician and they'll be playing a solo acoustic set. And then we've also got moaning Lisa, which I played lead guitar in and yeah my friends their child,

And Haley going to be jumping on it and acoustic set with me so we don't often do those. So it'll be a cute little rare opportunity and we'll play some covers as well. And then finally we've also got some own spittle and she's actually going to be releasing an album thinking a couple of weeks. So she's a queer singer-songwriter and a Survivor and we're really excited to have her because

We'll also be bringing two choirs. Wow, which will probably be I think about 30 people in the choir. So with our rainbow voices and the Divine divas and the rainbow voices. I believe are coming all the way from Kyneton to be a part of this event. Wow, you two choirs. No, let's not just not just want ya to so that's what's a huge event. That's a lot of great.

Entertainment, which is really really amazing and it's good to see, you know, sort of, you know, all that sort of queer representation. That's really really wonderful as well. Jody Now sort of drill it. Let's come back to you, you know sort of, you know, you want that visibility in the community, but how does that if I can ask connect specifically to you and why you know as a queer person and how you decided to run for run for office.

As I say, yeah. Well, I'm proud to be running as a queer woman and something that's really kind of made me more aware of maybe radicalized my feminism over the last year or so is that I had a baby and I've heard that from a lot of women that having a baby can really bring in bring to the fore that their feminism which is always been

Been the driving force behind my politics anyway, and I've been interacting with a lot of Institutions through that process. Yeah, and my little Rainbow family has had sort of not not always found that easy we've particularly we had experience with many Valley Council accessing their Maternal Child Health Services that sort of surprised.

Us that they at some point referred to Father's like that we had a we had a parent's group where it was great. We were really enjoying the parents group. They say Partners welcome and then at certain point we got through a text message saying father's not welcome know which leg my partner is not a father. So that's not a great feeling but and obviously there's lots of non birthing.

Ants who for, you know, we could have quite understand that there might you might want to have a session that was only for birthing parents and their you know, like unique sort of challenges that they might be experiencing after birth. They was a bit. Yeah. It was a bit of a shock in 2024 to see that whole group referred to as just father's yeah. Yeah. So just just to call so well to put it into that part of the story.

Instead of what happened when you raise this with city of many value, you know, the mean of the council did deal with it really? Well, they sent through some feedback and I you know, I pointed out to them that at some point I would be going back to work and my partner would become the primary caregiver and we felt that these Services were really essential that they were inclusive for both of us. Yeah because we both need that support and they

Were really good they sort of offered, you know, how they could change their services in the future. But also think about how to how to support us through our parenting Journey at the moment, but it's still I guess put a bit of a sour mmm. It's our feeling on the whole whole the whole thing that we were quite looking forward to to be honest making new new parent friends. Yeah.

Yeah, when something is dear to your heart and it sort of gets low, you know sort of it gets dented. So tainted tainted. Yeah, it's sort of a it's more than a taint in a way because there's you know that degree of extra feeling involved in it. Yeah, so I'm sure that they're their hearts in the right place and they do want to provide inclusive services, but maybe maybe the training hasn't been adequate or maybe they are not talking enough.

Off to the lived experiences of residents who and and really understanding how to not just I had noticed that in the past. They'd run a lgbtqia community Advisory Group that's real Focus had been on promoting lgbtqi issues in the community, but I didn't see in their terms of reference. Like I sense that though that reference group would actually inform the services that Council run because that's super important right the game.

Lancelot interfacing with the community all the time in these like vulnerable moments right like new parents. Yeah, and they should be listening to the community and lived experience about how to deliver those services in like a really inclusive way. Absolutely. So all right, we'll have a we're gonna have some of the music now and I'll come back to Ellen to talk about this one because I pray scheduled the track. Carrie. Tell us a little about Carrie. I want a girl. Okay, so Kari,

Well, the song is the name. Carrie actually comes with Carrie Brownstein from sleek and out. Awesome. We're musician and we release this song I think back in 2018. But yeah, it's it's a queer Anthem. Basically just yelling out in the top of your lungs. You know, I want a girl fair enough. Let's have a look listen to it Carrie by moaning Lisa and it is on 3 CR 855 am 3 CR Digital 3. And we're talking Jody about your sort of reasons for running and that sort of thing. I had suppose I have to be diplomatic and neutral as a presenter if you get elected, I'm sure you're wanting to say when you know, what would be the things you'd like to get involved in to make sure many Valley moonee Valley Council does on any front, but obviously this is a quid program. So let's talk queer stuff as well. Yeah. Well queer people are suffering from the housing crisis.

He's right. Now we kind of all are but that to me, you know, we the way we campaign in the greens is that we go out and talk to people we Dornoch we find out what's going on in the local area and I have to say like the housing crisis is a is really friend of mine for so many people and so the policy that we're running on in moonee Valley is to look at our rates scheme and

Charge people higher rates for leaving their property is vacant seems like there's about close to 10% of properties in Flemington that are left vacant. Meanwhile, we've got people who don't have anywhere to live, right who and and if we can put pressure on people who are land banking or just, you know, leaving their houses vacant that puts pressured downward pressure on whence.

Gives people places to live, you know housing is a human right? So this is this is like a the big change that we that our Declan and I is candidates for many Valley Council of really talking to a community about at the moment and I have to say people are really receiving that well. Yeah. No, look, he's a big issue. Look I just the last week my have to pay for the first time at 14% rent increase and the parallels cold.

That was a compromise. So yeah all the feels. I'm not in moonee valley. But of course, it's everywhere around least Metro Melbourne. I'm not sure if it's affecting Regional as much but certainly of course in capital cities around so-called Australia. It is definitely happening. So yeah housing is a big one. What else also interested in making sure that the many Valley Pride Community Advisory Group is back up and running making sure that Council services are included.

Rusev like we were just talking about before the before the song because

You know, there are lots of lgbtq. I people I look I know from from living there and and there there and ready to support the council and delivering their services. I don't know why Council of not been liaising with that reference group recently, but it's a great

resource. Yeah, so it's still there. It's still officially formed the reference group, but it's there's no liaison.

That's very mysterious. I'd be you know that same yeah, I'm my logical brain is just melted on that one. Why would you have reference group if you're not going to refer to it anything else? We've also I've been hearing a lot from people especially in Flemington is that people don't have garages and want to think about electric vehicles. Yeah. So meaning Valley Council really has an opportunity to invest in

In invest in like infrastructure, like charging station infrastructure that that people can't do themselves if they don't have garages Flemington is like got a lot like a lot of historical small-block Victorian Terraces, you know Bluestone lanes and and yeah, most people just don't have garages but also really worried about the climate crisis. So I think many Valley could

Could lay down that definitely so and there's one other area that you're interested in I think as well of promoting which sort of links into the events that you're wanting. Yeah, that's right. So arts and culture as well. Like Allen said before there's so much talent in in many Valley and so much like so many young people and queer people who really want to get out and get involved, but we look around at the council's around us that like Mary Beth.

Back and maribyrnong and Melbourne who are really investing in and supporting arts and culture and they feel like actually many Valley could step up I worked in I've worked in Community Arts for more than a decade. I worked for snuff puppets and National Institute of circus arts. And and so I I do know what these organizations need to thrive because I've been in in the enrolls there and I know how you really have to make a lot out of a little and and arts artists are amazing at like being efficient and and really really like building Community out of like whatever they can get and that's that Council needs to invest in that.

Definitely Ellen. I think that's probably a good place for you to chip in and take that further as an artist. Perhaps tell us as well about your journey as an artist and particularly moonee Valley, but anything that you sort of think is relevant on this particular point and anything else. Yeah, for sure. I guess the first thing that comes to mind is obviously a lot of music venues are really suffering right now and I'm sure you've all heard before with the insurance hikes and all of that sort of stuff and it's just really really tough to be operating a venue at the moment. And so like I feel like greens and counsel, you know, really? I feel like really can help change like for example. I know like in your city council Gary old every tree has been spearheading the save live music campaign. Hmm. And yeah, and you know, we need all the support that we can get like yesterday. I was just like driving through, you know a venue that had recently closed down and I remember playing with Mona Lisa there and it was just really disheartening. Yes to like, you know, we as musicians obviously need platforms, you know to make art to connect with the community and share our music. So yeah, and also, you know Moonee Valley like I feel like we could really benefit from you know, doing more their terms of like arts and culture and you know, as Jodi said we do have a very vibrant like queer Community, but it's just we need more events to kind of really engage and connect and create each other.

Yeah, I think it is very very important. We all know that you know quiz, being creative and neurodivergent all that sort of thing. Perhaps don't tend to fit into what I'll call the big inverted commas, you know majority 925 lifestyle at times and if they try to you know, we try it can damage our mental health or we're not quite sort of as you know, best as we could be achieving a potential all that sort of stuff. So it is very very important that councils and all levels of government do support arts and support art strongly and of course 3 CR has a community

station that supports local music would be is right behind that we're here and we're here to play your music as well. And yeah, that's it is just so important. So it is really good. I mean, can I ask if it's okay to ask personally? I mean, how do you manage as an you know sort of do you find I cut you know, it is their stress also emotionally and mentally and I know you can be financially. Yeah that sort of thing and how do you balance that? We've sadly got to earn a living and sometimes do the proverbial day job. That wouldn't be our first preference or our higher preferences. How do you manage all that? What do you do? Yeah. I mean, you're right like it isn't easy. It is tricky, you know, particularly, you know about, you know playing music.

Music playing shows. It's like, you know, it is a gig economy. And yeah, because nowadays it's you know, it's easier than ever to be making recording your music at home. But at the same time it's also you have to be like, you know, your own manager. You're going to be your own marketing person love that stuff. So you know, it does come with a lot of work and I think I'm fortunate enough to be in a bad for people that we can kind of share the workload amongst each other. And even though we will have like day jobs, but we kind of yeah are able to manage that by yet really sharing the load I guess and yeah.

Yeah don't have to tell me where tell us where of course my really appreciate you sharing that and the vulnerability that's involved because it's not an easy topic, you know, we all have our passions and the long-suffering listeners of 3 CR know mine, which I'll come to later in the show. But what sort of day job. Do you do that at least makes it will say bearable if that's this that yeah. Well, okay. Well, I'll do a few things. Yes, where do I begin? Actually, I work for a not-for-profit organization called The Guardian which is actually in a be confident.

So, you know, I work as a marketing officer, you know, and we basically put on shows for culturally diverse communities and for artists called as well. So and then I do like two days as a dental assistant working with special needs patients. Yeah, and so in amongst that obviously volunteering do a bit of volunteering work.

Is running an election campaign event. That's a bit of volunteering as a Powerhouse mental health sometimes but you know, yeah so doing that. But yeah, I also musicians like we feel like it's a very common theme in the Arts and I guess

Music Community. It's not like a lot of musicians have to take on lots of different jobs and wear a lot of different hats. But yeah, it is a you know, obviously with also like, you know the cost of living in the housing crisis like it does really, you know affect everybody. But yeah, that's my train of thought there. No, look it.

It isn't easy, you know, we're struggling to keep the bills paid and how do we do that? And it's not like we've got an again huge inverted commas big white collar 925 full-time careers, all that sort of thing. It's not easy and look I can, you know, very very much feels with you because some is the long-suffering listeners of this show. My passion is professional wrestling and I love doing the commentary and ring announcing on that button and other artistic things, but it's often hard to

The work and now I do various day jobs diversity educator still doing some bits of accounting which it's hard to find the environments that I need to do that sometimes because are they not so much queer informed? I'm reasonably okay with that but are they, you know convergent mental health informed that sort of thing. So yeah, I very much that's why I ask because I just think the more ideas we can get out there on how to deal with it how people manage it I think is very very important for

Diverse people and very much queer people as part of that. Yeah. So thank you for sharing that. I think we might have the next the next track that you've popped in for us today. And that's your single that is mining leases moaning. Lisa's single Wayside. Tell us a little about why site mmm, so ways that is our latest single release, so we had a bit of a break after releasing our first album and now so we're back to releasing music.

This one does relate to myself but I'm a little bit excited about this because it does have relevance to gender equity in a way as the long-suffering listeners of this show know that I'm in love and him involved in as a commentator and ring announcer in professional wrestling and yesterday was my standing gig on the noon show at Alpha Pro Wrestling doing commentary. But as always hung around hang out with the peeps and through the afternoon and it turned out one of the commentators on the evening show wasn't available.

So I filled in but what made this extra special was I got to commentate with another woman The Fabulous Jem Stone. And as far as we know this could be the first time in Australia that there's been an all-female commentary team doing professional wrestling, which is a bBit of a landmark wrestling has been male-dominated. So I'm just a little bit excited still a little bit excited today for that but it is of relevance to this show. It's great to see I'm still checking out trying to get to verify that it is logical I've checked with one person who was has been involved in Australian wrestling for around 45 years. He cannot recall.

Thanks so much for reaching out to us to provide feedback regarding the recent changes to the inclusive collection and reporting of sex and gender data and Victorino Health Services. We are very sorry. This has caused you to stress. We acknowledge. This is a complex change to show you that we are monitoring its implementation. We will draw and concerns such as your such as the advice of lgbtgia+ community advisory groups and Health Services. We do so these

reporting changes in the guidance document or developed following extensive consultation including with trans and gender diverse communities are inclusive collection and reporting of sex and gender data and notes note also rain and recommends that Health Services collect current or legal sex. In addition. Let clinicians will continue to collect a range of other information required to ensure safe clinical decision-making that needs the health of Diverse Health needs of their patients over time. The data collected will be build a better evidence based on the health needs and outcomes for lgbtqia+ people. Thanks again for your feedback. We hope this information is of assistance kind regards equity and diversity team government Statewide programs hospitals and Health Services Division.

Point of health and can name is replied. So in essence do not seem to understand you're not just causing distress. You are causing discrimination. We still don't know who was consulted about the changes everyone that she and I have talked to were blindsided by this change don't recall any surveys and and as you noted that it would be shared on social media and giving it to publicly available. That's why I've read it out. So yeah, it's still causing concern for Trans and gender diverse people this I don't think it's been well managed at all and I would definitely like to know who was involved in this because it just does not seem right to me. So that's the update on that one very quickly freedom of species is coming up at 1:00 in a few minutes time if you're listening live and don't forget you can listen to all the 3 CR programs on demand and on podcast

and today the Fab Freedom species crew have a repeat of a fabulous interview with Zane McNeil about their book Vegan entanglements and because they'll have Zane on again in a few weeks with the new interview about a new book. So a prolific writer there and great information on the freedom of species show as always covering all things vegan vegetarian and animal. Advocacy.

What else? Well, yes as I quickly mentioned during the show that unfortunately it seems the Federal Government has reneged on its some commitment to end discrimination against LGBT while say Igbtqa+ students and teachers insects not included in this one. And of course a federal election due sometime in around the next 12 months. We've got to make sure these things get on the map and that's a question. Why is the federal government not heating what queer people want. Are they not listening? Are they not getting good advice? Who knows? We'll have to get to the bottom of it.
