Now of course we have all the research type of estimates that give these sorts of things and but often they're not as comprehensive as we would like. But if we know there's concentrations in certain areas, we might want to Target health services, so that's one. Simple logical example of why we need to ask these questions. That is the case because of course sometimes in the past we haven't all been working together and so he's now sort of put the ball back in the ABS as caught but he the fact that as Jenny said in one of her messages earlier that he was prepared to just overrun, the the override. So the ABS is of great concern. Just also Jenny's come back and said, Julian Hills of gay men in the city of dandong. And one of the most conservative labor areas, where his Federal colleague, Sandra Fernando's part of the right faction and the shop Alliance Union with a homophobic past and now where they sort of got a bit better, whether they've cleaned it all up. So I don't think the Alp has to be scared of everything on lgbtiq, a plus or for that matter, Progressive moves forms of diversity, Etc.

And now my other theory is, they're still sort of in, you know, deep shell shock over the 2019 loss. Well, I've no, it's dr. And let's look at it from crude political terms. This particular issue would cost labor votes more than it would gain them votes. In my opinion, I don't really see that. It's going to be too many people changing votes, you know, sort of you know because supports not suddenly supporting labor, because they don't want queer questions or not enough. Quick questions in

the census, but they're certainly going to lose votes to some degree to Greens and Independence in seats where they're under threat. So politically, it doesn't make much sense. Either from where I'm sitting, you know, I just think that the LP of got to get some nerve back at a federal level. It's really disconcerting to see what is going on.

Now, the other story that turned up today and I'll say huge content, not on this one. Herald-sun deciding to do a beat-up, Gee surprise surprise and the story that big is on the front page and mainly on page 5 of the tree addition as I reach for it. You know the usual beat up type of stuff from a Murdoch media paper and Exclusive by Carly Douglas children as young as five will be asked if there are if they identify as a she he or they will. no, we need to ask everyone. So what's the big deal in my opinion and sort of? This has the full report on page 5, then says, this is taxpayer, pundit. Yes, always throw that emotive phrase in guidelines, rolled out to public libraries across the state. Well, it doesn't matter whether it's libraries and we still haven't heard, I haven't had any more on the health services forms issue. Now sort of

And I know that a small medium-sized Independent News Outlet, didn't want to run a piece on that which is very disappointing staff at public libraries. Have been given the new guidelines on how to be. Queer friendly adding books to on gender diversity, promoting drag time, story events, well, that's called freedom of expression. That's what libraries are about. And whether you agree or disagree with things, libraries have to have freedom of expression. Now, I might not agree with say, Views of them sort of people from the Australian, Christian Lobby to give one sort of straw case example. But if one of them put out an autobiography, yes, a library, you know, by suppose by and large has a right to stock it except where it promotes, hey, outright hate. So, coming back to this report and it also says not assuming gender or sexuality of children? Well, you shouldn't.

Now just don't assume that someone is heterosexual, they might be because that's where things come in assumptions are so much a part of the problem that we live in an assumption that is or an expectation about society's attitudes on, gender, sexuality, and sex characteristics, and coming back to the census issue. It's been disturbing to see a large majority of news, outlets of All Sorts, not mention variation of sex characteristics at all. And I do feel for my, I'll say intersex cousins so to speak. They are now sort of. So the coming back to this article though, libraries asked primary school children for their pronouns? Well what difference does it make whether its primary secondary or anyone else? So this is just the children beat up and you just check in casually which is fair enough.
