How another country can challenge someone's laws. But if you even if you do

To do that. You could be detained or deported or turned back. So you know, it's an unfortunate thing to say and putting in particular, people have relatives in the u.s. There can be no in can't visit them or, you know, perhaps there's a need to go for a funeral or a wedding or something or standard like that. It could be very, very difficult.
